### President's Message

The heat has now come once again to cause us to change how we service our pools and how we should try and protect ourselves from the heat. I always bring a cooler full of ice and bottled water, and drink ten to twelve bottles a day. Another thing you can do is start your route earlier in the morning. If you call your customers ahead, I don't think they would mind if you started their service at 6:00 am or 6:30 am to beat the heat. Wearing a good sun hat will help keep you cool as well. Try to finish your route by 2:00 pm. The hottest part of the day is around 3:00 to 4:00 pm. Try to do your phone calls or office work in the afternoon.

As for the pool, there are 7 things I would recommend checking during the heat this summer.

- 1. Run the pool filter timer at least 8 hours a day for single speed pumps and 10 to 12 hours for VS pumps at low RPM. Start the run cycle around 6:00am or earlier.
- 2. Make sure the filter stays clean or replace it if needed. (This saves you money on chemical usage).
- 3. Keep at least 3 chlorine tabs in the floater or chlorinator.
- 4. Keep the chlorine level around 4.0 or leave your customer some extra chlorine to use during the end of the week.
- 5. Make sure the conditioner level is high enough to hold the chlorine. Some pools need a higher level than others. For example, salt pools need to be 60ppm to 80ppm.
- 6. Keep the pH at 7.4. Chlorine is more active at 7.4 than at 7.8.
- 7. Check the phosphate numbers and keep them in the recommended range. High levels will cause algae growth and more chemical usage.

#### Massive Water Restrictions Are Now CA Law

Many Californians may not know that over the next several years, massive water restriction laws are going into effect. These laws, AB 1668 & SB606, will require Californians to consume only 55 gallons of water, per person, per day – a reduction of nearly 50 percent based on some calculations. In the coming decade the restrictions will be even more severe. Though the details about how commercial, or landscaping usage (swimming pools could be included in this category) will be reduced are not specific, the message is clear to Californians – every drop of water counts, literally, because those who use more water than the restrictions allow will face heavy fines. As a result of all of this, you may notice customers becoming increasingly focused on finding and fixing all kinds of water leaks as quickly as possible. Please remember that American Leak Detection Sacramento is here, and has been here for more than 35 years, to help your customers get the resolution they need in the shortest amount of time, with the least disruption possible.

#### New Insurance Coverage Now in Effect

Route Income Disaster Loss Coverage. As of April 1, 2018, members are now covered for income loss because their customers' property was damaged by a flood, earthquake, wildfire, tornado or hurricane. Swimming pool service techs can't buy this coverage anywhere else and it is exclusive to IPSSA members. The new coverage was conceived after the catastrophic hurricanes in Florida, Flooding in Houston and wildfires in California. Coverage limits are \$25,000 per regular member for up to one-year of income loss and it is provided at no additional cost to members.

#### This is in addition to your current coverage

- \$1 million coverage for chemical injuries and property damage;
- Coverage for hazardous material spills from trucks and on the jobsite;
- \$5,000 coverage for medical bills due to accidental injury on the jobsite (regular members only);
- Coverage for water-borne diseases like E.coli, Legionnaire's, Staph and Cryptosporidium;
- \$50,000 life insurance to age 70 (\$20,000 from 70 80);
- Broadened property damage coverage (aka: faulty workmanship coverage) covering start-ups, and damage to the item you're working on, e.g. tile;
- Coverage to re-key customer's locks if keys are lost.



At the June meeting, we were honored to present three checks (\$2,200) to the Sunrise Recreation and Park District. These checks go to fund the inaugural CVIPSSA Swim & Safety Program.

\$1,500 was raised by our chapter through the auction and raffles at our May Vendor Showcase. \$500 was matching funds from IPSSA corporate. \$200 was donated by Drewski's Hot Rod Kitchen.

#### Santa's Summer Getaway

It's hard to believe it's almost pool season and you are probably gearing up for a great and busy season. We just know that at the end of it, you will be looking for a place to relax and recuperate. Well, do we have a deal for you!

Santa's Summer Getaway will be September 14-16 at Sly Park, **Group Site 3**. We have changed sites this year so we will have room for up to 12 rigs and plenty of tent space. As RV spaces are limited (but not nearly as much so as last year) sites will be reserved as paid registration is received. The reservations are not site specific, and will be on a "choose as you arrive" basis.

Add on to that campfires, smores, the lake, crafts, horseshoes, great company and lots of time to relax and you probably think it can't get any better.

Not a camper or can't make the whole weekend – that's OK. You can also come for just Saturday for \$25 for adults, \$15 for kids.

#### Capital Valley IPSSA Begins Swim and Safety Program

CVIPSSA has partnered with the <u>Sunrise Recreation and Park District</u> to expand the District's swim and safety programs. The program's objective is to make swimming lessons and water safety education accessible to immigrant and low income children in the local community. CVIPSSA's grant will benefit approximately 25 children and their families who would not otherwise have the means to take swimming lessons.

Participants will receive 16 thirty-minute swim lessons over 4 weeks for the children and two River and Lake Safety Days for the whole family. During the River and Lake Safety Days, they will learn how to use a life jacket, and various water safety ideas, e.g. swim with a buddy and using assists for struggling swimmers. The information is similar to a standard American Red Cross Basic Water Rescue class. The local DART (Drowning Accident and Rescue Team) will attend the Safety Days, participate in the instruction, explain their mission to the families, and show the kids their rescue equipment.

CVIPSSA is excited about this partnership and bringing a successful outreach program to the Antelope Aquatic Complex. This grass-roots program will promote the drowning prevention mission that all of us embrace as aquatics professionals. Call 916-725-1585 for more information.

#### **Legislative Update**

SB 993 - Would require all businesses that do not meet certain exemptions to levy and pay a sales tax on their services.

SB 606 and AB 1668 would help implement the Governor's Water Plan as law. Included in this plan, and the pieces of legislation that would enforce it, is language granting power to the State Water Resources Control Board to require long-term efficient water use standards for indoor and outdoor residential use, up to and including quotas on usage. (Signed by Governor 5/31/18)

AB 1938 - would prohibit an employer from inquiring about whether a job candidate has children.

AB 2705 - would create a 2 year statute of limitations for claims of non-payment of workers' compensation by contractors.

SB 1272 - would help fight the underground economy. This hurts the pool industry by skirting the laws on taxes, workers' compensation, licensing and more, creating an unfair marketplace in which it is increasingly difficult to compete.
