Presidents Message

I hope everybody had a great 4th of July, and has found a way to stay cool even with the lack of water and the triple digit temperatures. Northern California has become more of a dry smoky arid desert. All of our reservoirs have hit record low levels. Folsom lake is now so low the Marina has been emptied of boats, which is not unheard of but is much earlier than we are accustom to. Our lakes and rivers are very low on water, and use will soon be restricted on most. So people will be turning back to their pools to stay cool.

This prolonged drought is creating special circumstances with our swimming pools. Most are in need of some sort of draining, either full or partial drains. Obviously, this is a hard pill to swallow for most. I have personally found that cleaning or replacing filters or filter cartridges, installing mineral packs such as Pool RX or Frog Packs, brushing, and making sure equipment run times are running long enough, pools have done really well recovering from their issues. Even the ones with high chemical readings of conditioner, TDS, and nitrates. High Phosphates and a lack of free chlorine can both be treated and fixed without draining by using phosphate removers and non-chlorine shock (O2 shock). You need to try everything you can to avoid draining pools at this point. Customers have been told they will be fined for wasting water or fined for over usage. So you can understand why they will call their local water company when they are told to drain their pool. Don't think for one minute that you can't also get fined for wasting water. If you send water down a storm drain you can be reported. So if you are a company that cleans your customers filter cartridges or grids curbside letting the water flow down the gutter, watch out. Some of the water districts are actually hiring water cops to drive around and ticket people wasting water. The media is asking people to report their neighbors so they can get live footage of people wasting water. It seems crazy but this will probably get worse. We have months until we may see rain and snow that will hopefully end this draught. Hopefully our state government can figure out how to manage our states water better. Do your part to conserve and work with your customers and educate them how they can save water. Fix the equipment leaks, fix the leaker pools and install pool covers or at least use the bottled liquid cover products. Make sure autofill devices are working properly and are not continuously running. The smallest fixes can make the biggest difference.

Summer maybe coming to a close for the swimming pool industry but it's still a hard push through to the winter. Hang in there and, we can all hope that the weather forecasters and scientists finally have it right with the prediction of a strong El Nino this winter season. Maybe the final nail in the coffin for the drought? Instead of a dry and mild winter extending the drought even further, the adverse is flooded pools packed baskets burned up pumps, maybe some frozen heaters and pools. No matter what the more extreme the weather the better it is

for business. No matter what all rain is welcome we have all had it with even hearing about the drought let alone seeing the effects of it. Brown lawns, dead trees, and green pools..... soooo over it!

Attention: School starts for most kids in this area August 10th. By the way, that's next week. I know time flies. Keep an eye out and drive careful in school zones, and residential neighborhoods. Children walking to and from school are even more distracted these days with cell phones, portable gaming systems, and MP3 players. We all need to be super cautious, and drive careful.
